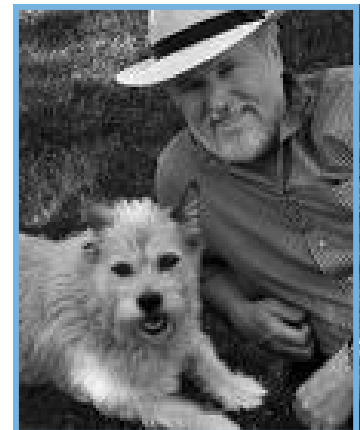

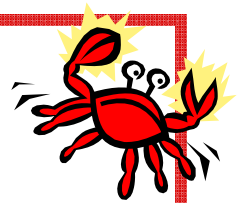
There was a winner this week:

Bryan opened meeting at 7:00am. Prior minutes approved.	
Secretary Report – We currently have 52 members. Final attendance for December was 89%, preliminary for January is 86%. Chris Barnes and Curtis Mussmann have requested a LOA. Discussion was held about the bylaws. RI and the District do not recognize LOA. Our bylaws allow under special circumstances. It was recognized we need a review of the bylaws. Don Morris has them electronically, Debbie will get them from him and the President/Past/Future group will review. Discussion was held on honorary members. Bryan asked the group to vote on Don Howard. Unanimous vote. Reviewed the SAR for all honorary, all were renewed.	Paul and Bryan will speak with Vic after the Friday meeting to get his membership information.
Treasurer Report – We have 13K in cash. Two members have not paid dues. Paul spoke of the VISA fees. There is a minimum fee, usually 1 1/2 %. We only pay for one machine. Total fees are about \$65 per month total, \$41 for wireless, the balance normal fees. Bryan would like to get to quarterly billing. This can be done through the website. One option to reduce fees is rid of wireless and use dial up. Discussed some options Scott Moore has offered. Paul will confirm costs of hooking up for purposes as BBQ, Fireworks Booth.
